Attendance & Punctuality

Evington Valley's attendance is still below the National average so we need to improve it! We are introducing some new incentives this year which we will share in the next Newsletter, but for now...

As parents we are asking you to stop and think before you allow your child to stay off school.

- Are they well enough to attend school?
- Is your child's attendance already a concern?
- Would it help if you dropped off paracetamol or medication for them during the school day? If so just sign the appropriate form in school
- Is there anything worrying your child at school or home?

Pupil and Parent Questionnaires


Thank you to all the pupils and parents who took the time to complete the questionnaires at the end of the year. The information is used to help evaluate what has gone well and what further improvements we need to make this year. Here is a summary of the results:

Pupil responses to questions

- 92% of pupils like coming to school
- 94% of pupils feel safe at school
- 94% of pupils know how well they are doing at school
- 95% of pupils can talk to the adults in school if they need to
- 84% of pupils think that the school deals with poor behaviour well
- 92% of pupils think they are taught well at school

Parent responses to questions

- 100% of parents say their child is happy at school
- 100% of parents say their child feels safe at school
- 99% of parents say their child makes good progress at school
- 100% of parents say their child is well looked after at school
- 99% of parents say their child is taught well at school
- 99% of parents say their child receives appropriate homework for their age
- 100% of parents say the school makes sure the pupils are well behaved at school
- 97% of parents say the school deals effectively with bullying
- 99% of parents say the school is well led and managed
- 99% of parents say the school responds well to any concerns that are raised
- 99% of parents say they receive valuable information about their child's progress
- 100% of parents say they would recommend the school to another parent
