

EVINGTON VALLEY PRIMARY SCHOOL

SPORT PREMIUM FUNDING

The government departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport are jointly providing additional funding to improve the provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools.

Schools are required to publish details of their PE & Sport Premium allocation, how they spend (or will spend) their PE and Sport grant. They must also include detail about the impact this funding has on pupils' PE and sport participation and attainment.

PE & Sport Premium Funding 2014-15

Evington Valley received £9,087 in PE & Sport Premium funding in the financial year 2014-15.

The funding was spent in the following ways:

<p>Enhancing swimming provision for Year 3 pupils</p> <p>Due to the number of pupils that were non-swimmers (45 of 47), swimming lessons for Year 3 pupils ran for the whole of the academic year, rather than a block of time.</p>	<p>At the beginning of the year, 45 of the 47 Year 3 children were non-swimmers. The vast majority of the 45 children had never been to a swimming pool before.</p> <p>By the end of the year, 8 children achieved their 25 metre award, 20 children could swim the width of the pool and all children had water confidence.</p> <p>21 children have been swimming with their families since their school lessons finished and 13 are now going swimming regularly with their family.</p>
<p>Enabling pupils to attend inter-school sports festivals and competitions (Paying into Leicester City School Sports Partnership, transport costs, providing teacher cover to release staff to take children to competitions).</p>	<p>Increased % of pupils involved in inter-school sports competitions from 29.9% in 2013-14 to 31.5% in 2014-15.</p>
<p>Subsidising after school sports clubs for KS1 & KS2 pupils.</p>	<p>Maintained % of pupils involved in after-school clubs- 30% of key stage 1 and 2 pupils. 100% of children who attended the sports clubs said:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • They enjoyed the club. • Their fitness improved. • They want the clubs to continue. • Their skills have improved e.g. kicking,

	<p>running, throwing, dancing etc.</p> <p>8 of the 78 children who attended the sports club have joined other out-of-school sports clubs.</p>
<p>Providing targeted Val Sabin PE training for all teachers which is then shared with colleagues. To raise their confidence and competence in teaching PE and sport. To increase teacher's subject knowledge and confidence in delivering an evaluating high quality PE lessons.</p> <p>Providing teaching cover to release staff for professional development.</p>	<p>After a 2 year period of training, all teaching staff have sufficient subject knowledge in order to plan, deliver and evaluate good PE lessons. Feedback from teachers who attended the training showed that all teachers have further developed their teaching skills and increased confidence in delivering quality PE sessions. 100% of teachers said their organisation and delivery of lessons has changed. There has been an increase in the amount of time pupils are active in lessons and also a positive impact on teaching and learning.</p>
<p>Purchasing new PE and sports equipment.</p>	<p>New equipment supported the teaching and learning for pupils including specific equipment that was bought to teach team games such as tag rugby and netball.</p>
<p>Develop young sports leaders in Key Stage 2.</p>	<p>Training day and further sessions working with the sports crew has encouraged/ developed children's confidence and leadership/team building skills. It has promoted PE and sports within school and further developed children's understanding of PSHE qualities required to be a positive role model/leader.</p>

PE & Sport Premium Funding 2015-16

The PE & Sport Premium Funding for 2015-16 will be spent in the following ways:

- CPD for teachers to enable them to further develop teaching skills in order to provide a varied PE curriculum to pupils.
- Purchasing the bronze membership through Leicester City School Sport & Physical Activity Network.
- Purchasing the swimming charter to support the teaching and assessment of swimming.
- To further increase the amount of pupils that attend inter-school sports festivals/ competitions.
- Continuing to update PE and sports equipment.
- Updating current planning and assessment documents for PE.
